Objective: Real analysis is a broad area of mathematics. We will be studying classical tools used in analysis. This is the first part in a two semester sequence. In this class we will focus on metric and topological spaces, compactness in metric and topological spaces, differentiability in normed vector spaces, and some of the mapping theorems.
