Prerequisites: Undergraduate real analysis

Objective: Real analysis is a broad area of mathematics. We will be focusing on the theory of measure and integration which has become an indispensable tool in remarkably diverse areas of mathematics. This is the first part in a two semester sequence. In this class we will focus on the theory of Lebesgue measure and integration on \mathbb{R} and in the second semester we will focus on general measure and integration over abstract measure spaces.
